

SYNOPSIS

The play is set on a Kiwi Farm in the 1990's

Henry is being forced into the mortgagee sale of his farm.

His neighbour, Jack, has been fired up by a marketing conference and they decide to grow a crop of marijuana to help the cash flow. Later, 20-year-old artist, Terry, a woman Henry met in Wellington, turns up unexpectedly, and Jack enlists the aid of his nephew, Hugh.

Act 1 Prologue: A marketing conference

Scene 1: Henry's kitchen

Scene 2: Henry's kitchen. Morning.

Scene 3: Jack's Snooker Room

Scene 4: Henry's kitchen. A month later.

Scene 5: Henry's kitchen. The next morning

Interval of 15 minutes

Act 2 Scene 1: 6 months later. Jack's Snooker Room

Scene 2: Henry's Kitchen. The next day

Scene 3: Henry's kitchen. The next morning

Scene 4: Henry's kitchen. A few days later

Anthony McCarten's **Weed** should be a kiwi classic. Perhaps it is.


MARK JENSEN — Jack Riordan

several Company Theatre productions (including When Dad Married Fury, One Man Two Guvnors) and is looking forward to his first show as director for Company.






HAMISH STEVENS - Henry Donovan
